While we are at this, can you get water tests done at Daniels Pond and the other nearby waterways. It would be most useful to have these after heavy rains or melting snow as well as average conditions.

Because there was another mulch pile fire a few nights ago, I just updated Chief McCarthy on both piles.

From a Fire Department perspective with the dirt pile I think it's mostly the issue I brought up last year about our ability to safely rescue someone in the event of a mishap. With the mulch pile it's probably more about the risk of the fire spreading. Since these are both current risks, Chief McCarthy was planning to connect with you and pursue in the Fire Department.

- > I have done a brief review of the Julian contract, RFP etc. There are so many problems with this beyond height and total volume -
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- > 1) rather than reducing the size I think it's bigger than when they took over! They should be required to pay us storage fees if not for the past, then the contract renewal should include financial penalties for violations that occur in the future.
- >
- > 2) the contract says they need written permission to operate anytime other than M-F 7am to 330. Who gave them permission? They are often there until 5, and work a number of Saturdays. However, now that people are paying attention I noticed they did not work this past Sat. I noticed because of the lovely quiet and went out back to check - no one there! 😊
- >
- > 3) I see requirements in the RFP that they comply with mining and OSHA rules but in a quick scan did not see any requirement that they comply with all coastal management and inland waterways that apply! I don't know that it's possible to comply at this location- and if it's not compliant it needs to be relocated to someplace that is. The neighbors have been trying to work with the town to get this resolved but many are willing to formally complain to CT DEEP and federal EPA if needed.
