I've had an opportunity to consolidate feedback from neighbors. Several have asked that I convey frustration with the lack of clarity on where we stand with open issues.

The most important open concerns have been consolidated in the attached. You will note that most of these are from our June 23 meeting and prior discussions.

We understand from First Selectman Tetreau that the town attorney is reviewing the Julian engagement. With that in mind I, along with [Redacted] would welcome a meeting with you and the town attorney to discuss these issues in greater detail. Recognizing that most of the issues identified have been unresolved for some time, we look forward to a response from the town and clarification of these items before we meet, as soon as possible.

Please use the document to respond inline to each point so that we are clear on the Town's position. If you don't have sufficient information to answer any of the questions at this time, please simply indicate "TBD" and indicate timing of next step.

If we can't get resolution on these issues quickly we will be looking to getting guidance from an environmental expert.
